# Forest Park Community Watch Safety Tips

### Make Your Home Always Look Occupied:

Leave some lights and a radio or TV on when you're not home.

#### Always Keep Your Outside Doors Locked:

Never leave your house open, if you are home or when you are not there.

#### Use Deadbolt Locks:

A deadbolt lock is a good deterrent to burglars.

#### Do Not Hide Your Key Outside:

Burglars know all the secret hiding places.

#### Drill and Pin Your Windows:

Window locks can be jimmied open; pins cannot.

#### Brace Sliding Glass Doors:

Lock sliding doors, and place a wooden or metal bar in the track of the doors.

#### Have Good Exterior Lighting:

Motion sensor lights and other good lights don't let a burglar hide in the dark.

#### Keep Bushes and Shrubbery Trimmed:

If your bushes are too high, someone hiding near your windows or doors can't be seen.

### Stop Mail and Paper Deliveries:

If you're out of town for a week or two.....stop deliveries <u>or</u> have one of your neighbors collect your mail and papers.

### Get a Dog:

Yes, even a small dog may be a deterrent to a burglar.

#### Install An Alarm System:

Homes with alarms are avoided by burglars.

### Watch For Suspicious Behavior:

- 1. Vehicles moving slowly with no apparent destination, or without lights.
- 2. Strangers looking into house windows or windows of parked cars.
- 3. Strangers walking through community, including common areas, checking to See who is home.
- 4. Sounds of breaking glass or other loud noises.
- 5. If you are aware that your neighbors are out of town, be aware of any unusual activity around their home.

# General Safety Suggestions:

- 1. Be aware of your surroundings. Many crimes occur right under the nose of people who just did not notice anything suspicious.
- 2. Safety and security are everyone's responsibility. You can reduce the possibility of becoming a victim of a crime by being alert to your environment.
- 3. Our safety and security ultimately depend on **US**. **WE** must take responsibility for our own safety.
- 4. Report all crime and any suspicious activity to the New Bern Police Dept.

## How To Report An Incident to the Police:

- 1. Briefly describe the event: what happened, when, where, and who was involved.
- 2. Give characteristics of the suspect including: sex, age, height, race, weight, hair color, clothing, and distinctive characteristics such as: facial hair, scars, tattoos, or accent. (You may not know all of these, but give all that you can).
- 3. Describe the vehicle, if there was one involved: color, make, model, year, license plate number, and any other features such as stickers, dents, or decals.
- 4. If you choose, you can give your name and address.
